Methodology

New Bridge Strategy conducted a survey among N=501 registered voters throughout Nebraska from April 8-13, 2022. Interviews were conducted via live telephone interviews (both cell phones and landlines) and online. Interviews were distributed proportionally throughout the state. Quotas were set for key demographic sub-groups, such as gender and age.

The margin of error is $\pm 4.38\%$ for the overall sample. The margin of error will vary for sub-groups.

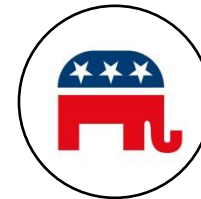

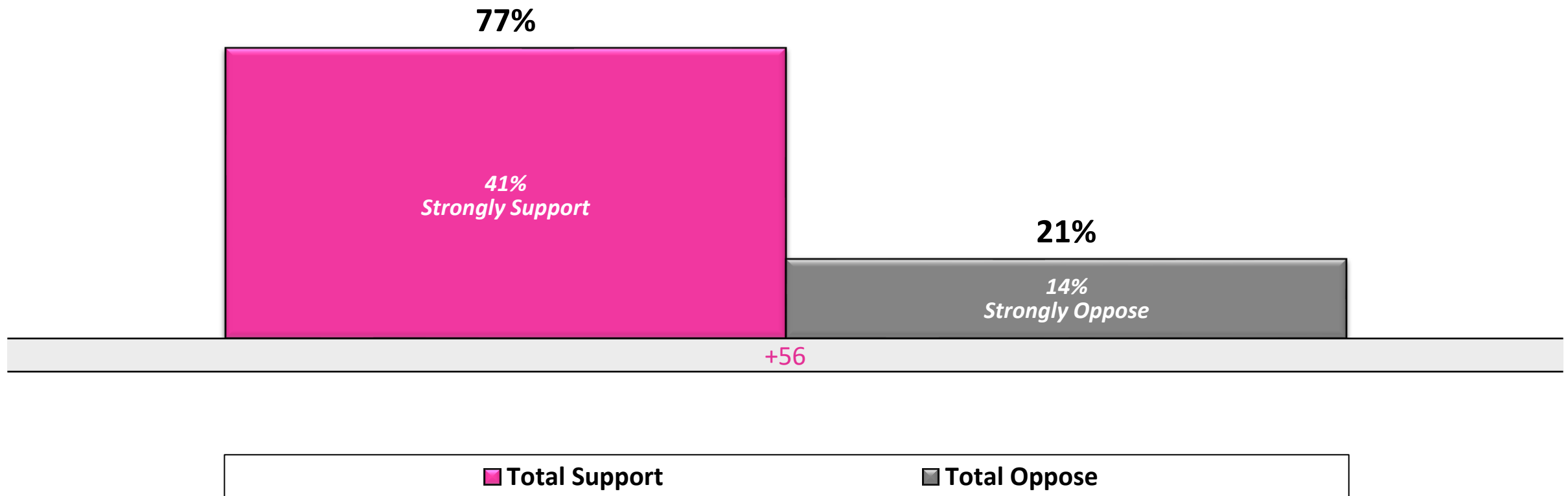

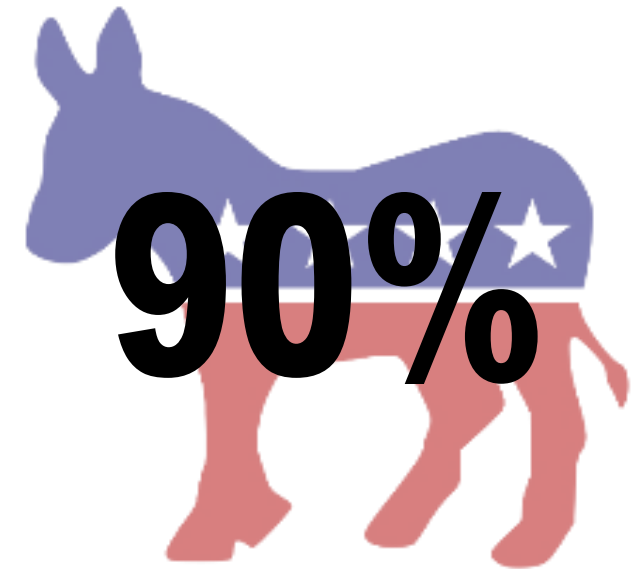
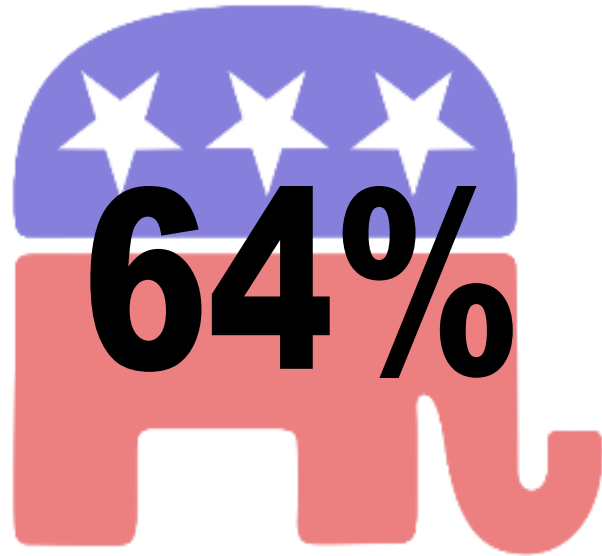
More than three-quarters of Nebraska voters offer support for the America the Beautiful effort.

America the Beautiful is a national effort with local collaboration to move toward an overall national goal of conserving thirty percent of land and waters in America, and thirty percent of ocean areas by the year 2030. Does that sound like something you would support or oppose?

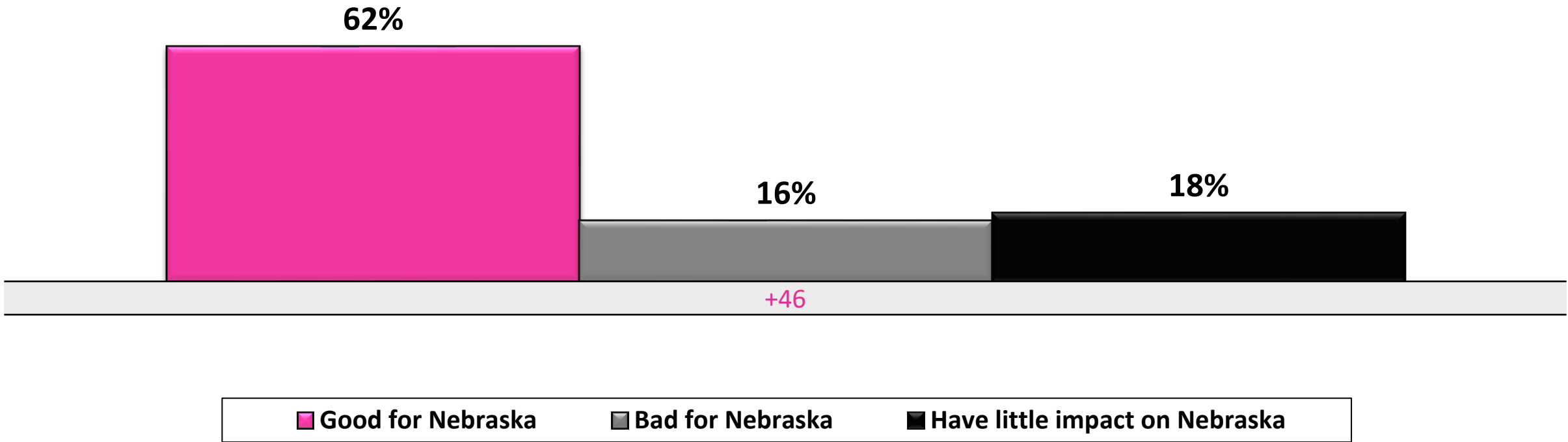


Majorities across party lines support this national goal to conserve 30% of lands and waters and ocean areas by 2030.

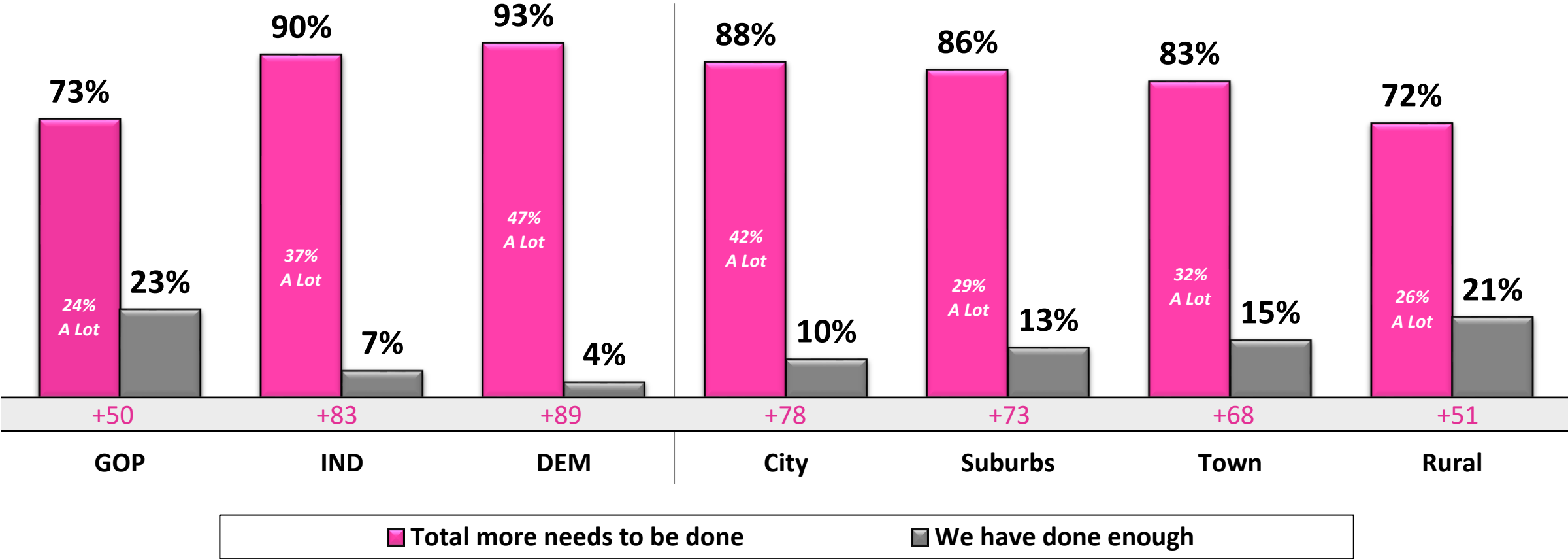

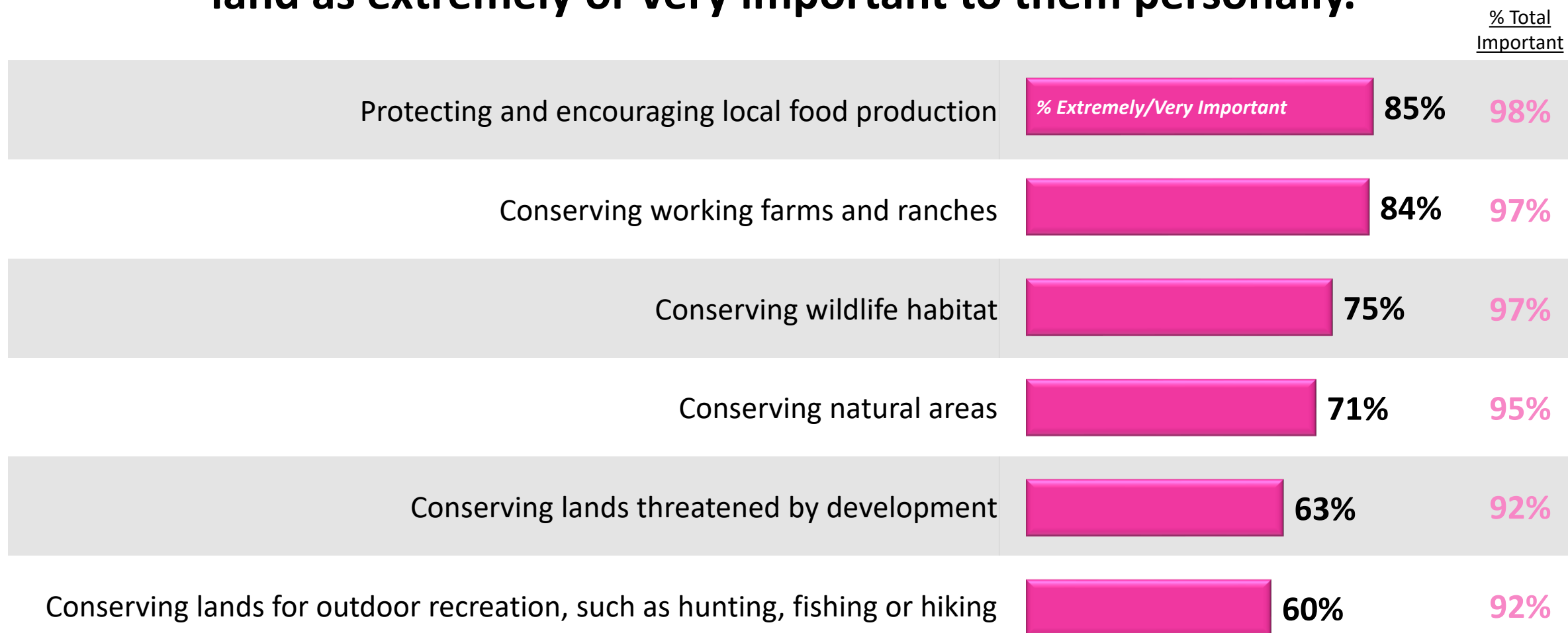
Thinking about land and water in Nebraska, which statement best represents how you feel?

Voters in every type of community say that local food production and conserving farms and ranches are extremely or very important goals.

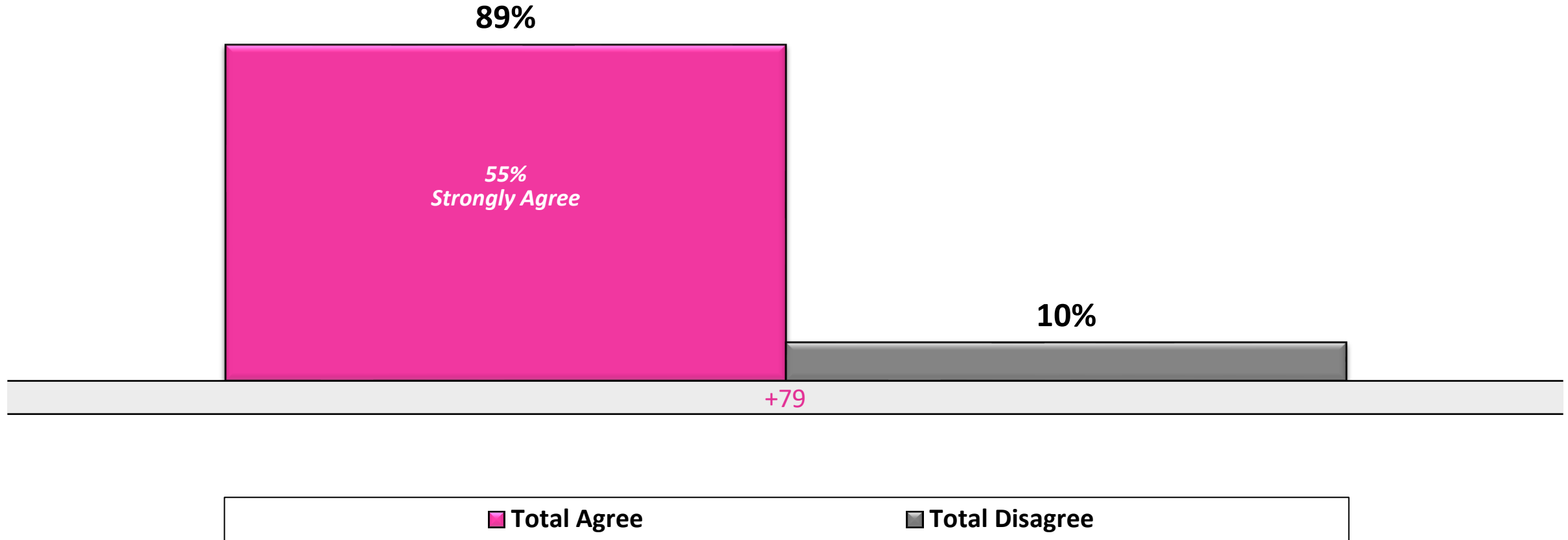

Nearly nine-in-ten say that landowners have the right to make permanent land use decisions; majority strongly agree.

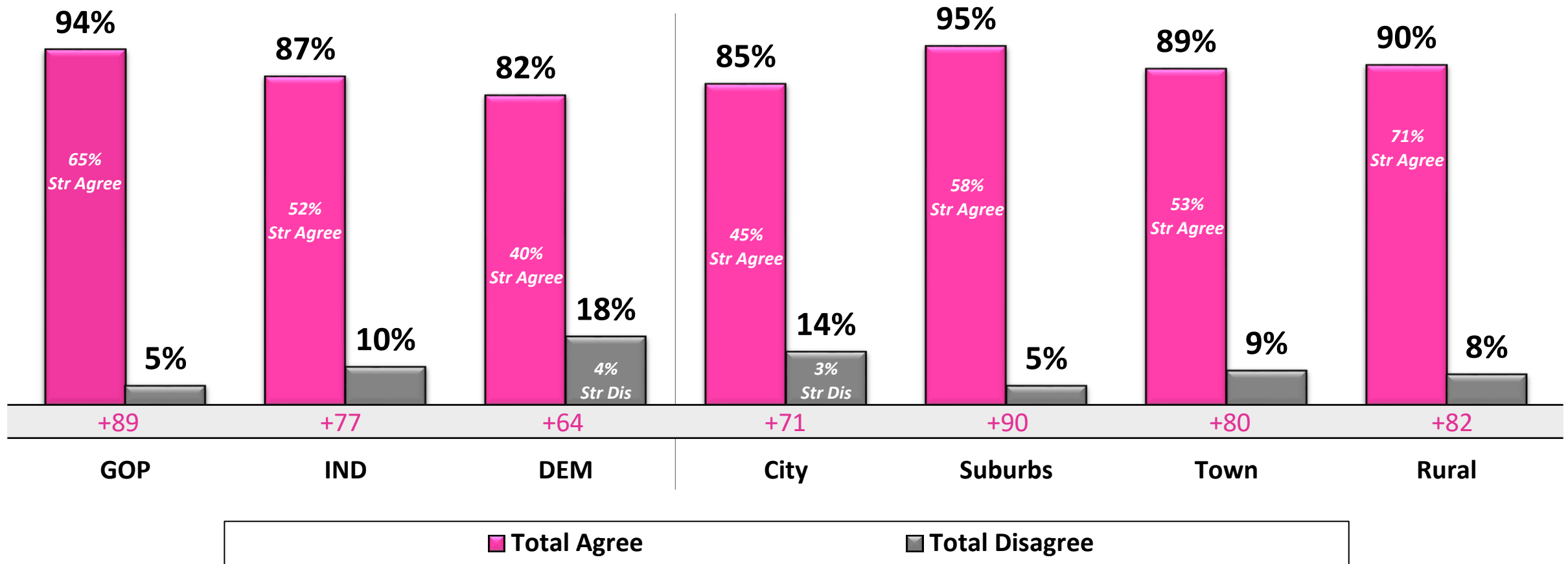
Landowners have the right to make permanent decisions about the use of their land.

Agreement is highest among Republicans; overwhelming in every type of community including rural areas.

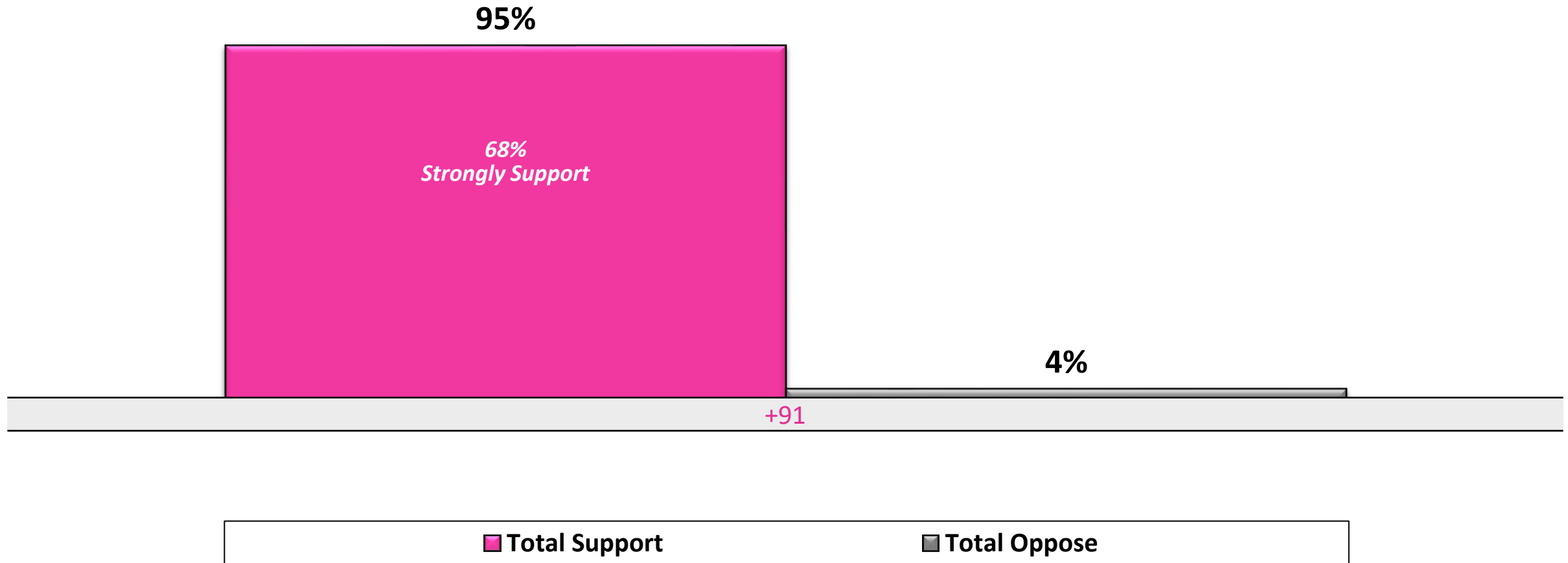

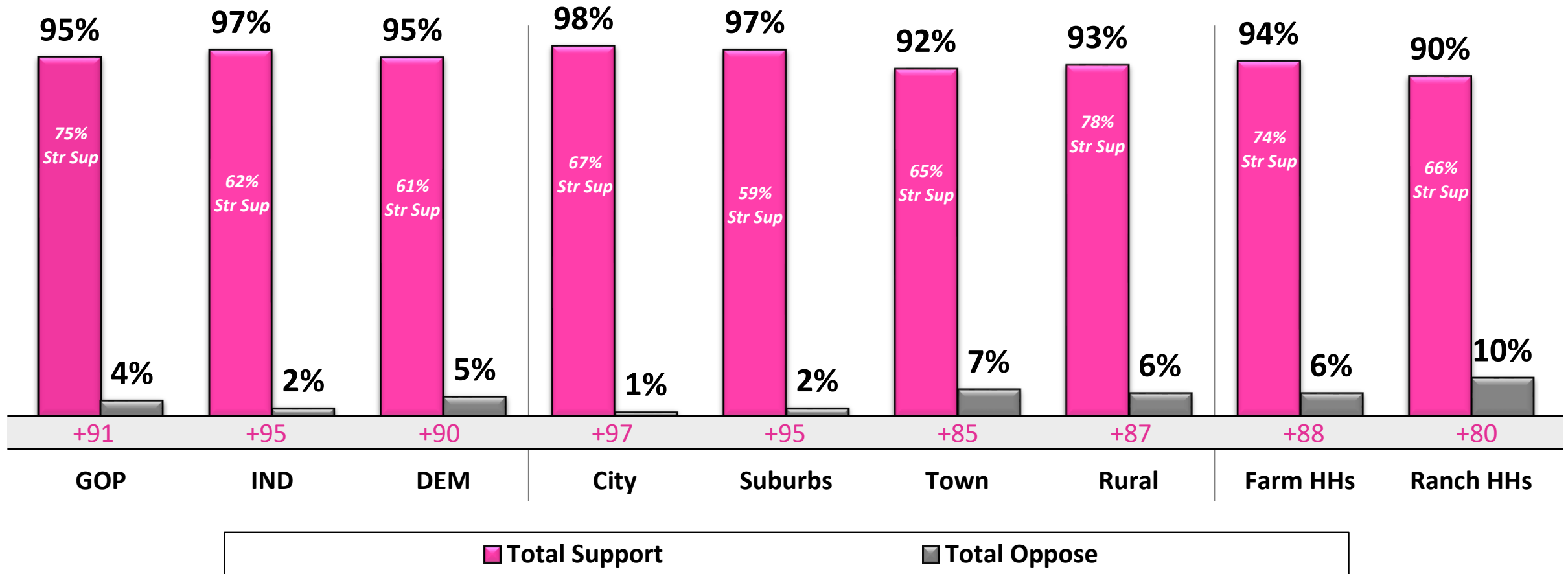
Do you agree or disagree with the following statement?

Nearly all support landowners' ability to conserve their land through voluntary conservation programs; two-thirds strongly support.

One way to conserve working ranches, farms, water, and wildlife habitat in Nebraska, is to work with willing landowners who utilize voluntary conservation programs on their property. These programs enable landowners to keep farms and ranches in agricultural use or as wildlife habitat into the future. 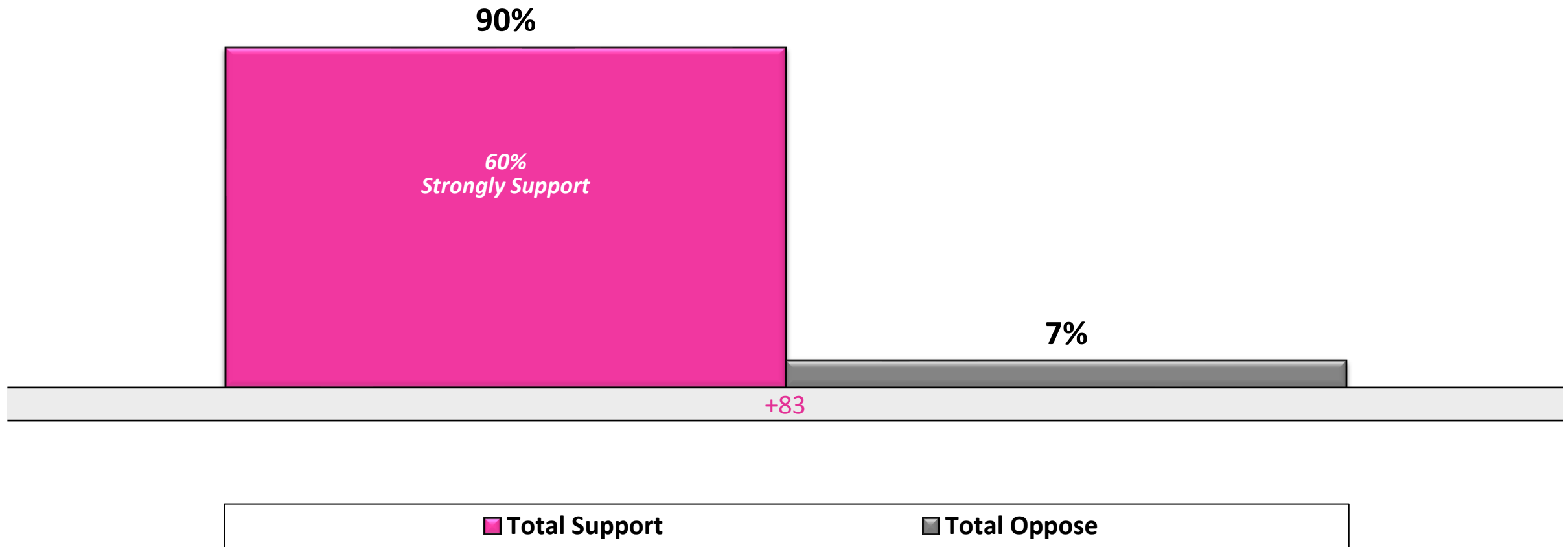


Support for landowners' ability to conserve their lands is high across party, community type, and with farmers and rancher households.



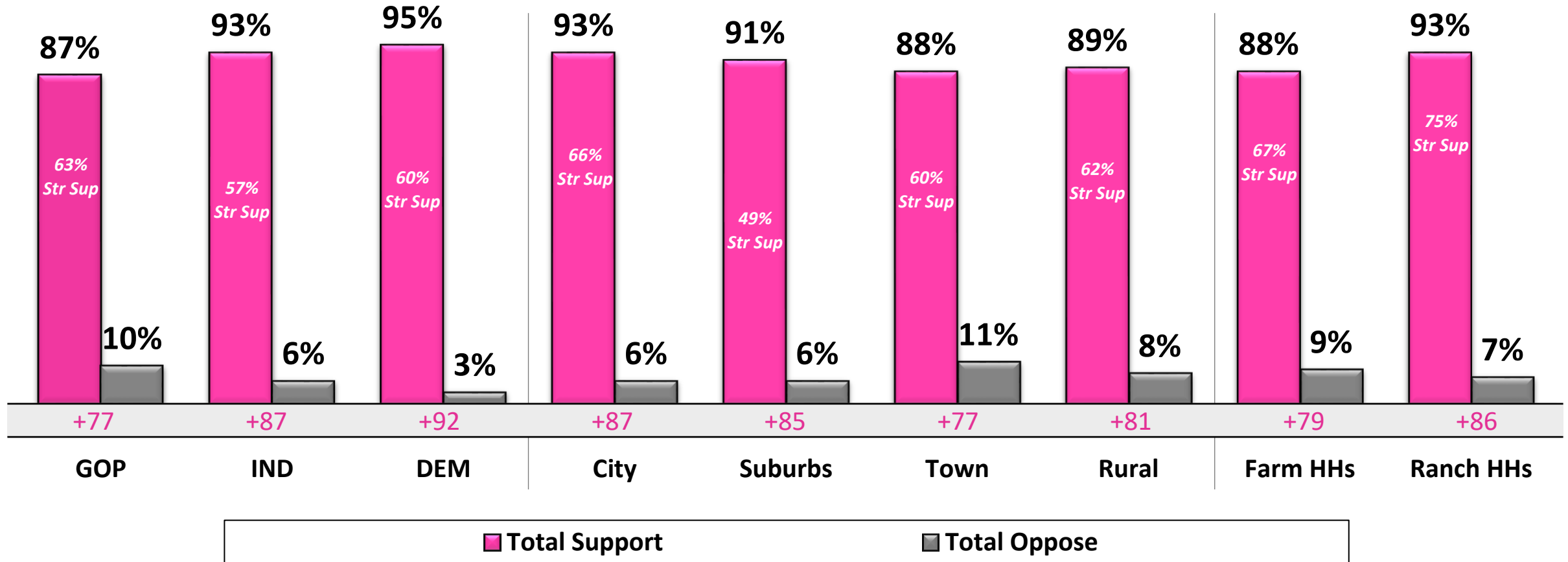
Do you support or oppose private landowners' ability to conserve their lands as working farms, ranches or habitat through voluntary conservation programs?

Nine-in-ten would encourage the Governor to support these voluntary conservation programs; a mere 7% want him to oppose.

Voters across party, community type, and in farm and ranch households want the Governor to support allowing landowners to conserve their land.

More voters agree with a rationale in support of voluntary conservation programs, rather than an opposition statement.

Supporters of using voluntary conservation programs say that determining the future use of your land is one of the most fundamental property rights. This is a cherished American value that allows landowners to keep their land as working farms and ranches into the future so that they are not developed and preserve the rural character of our state.

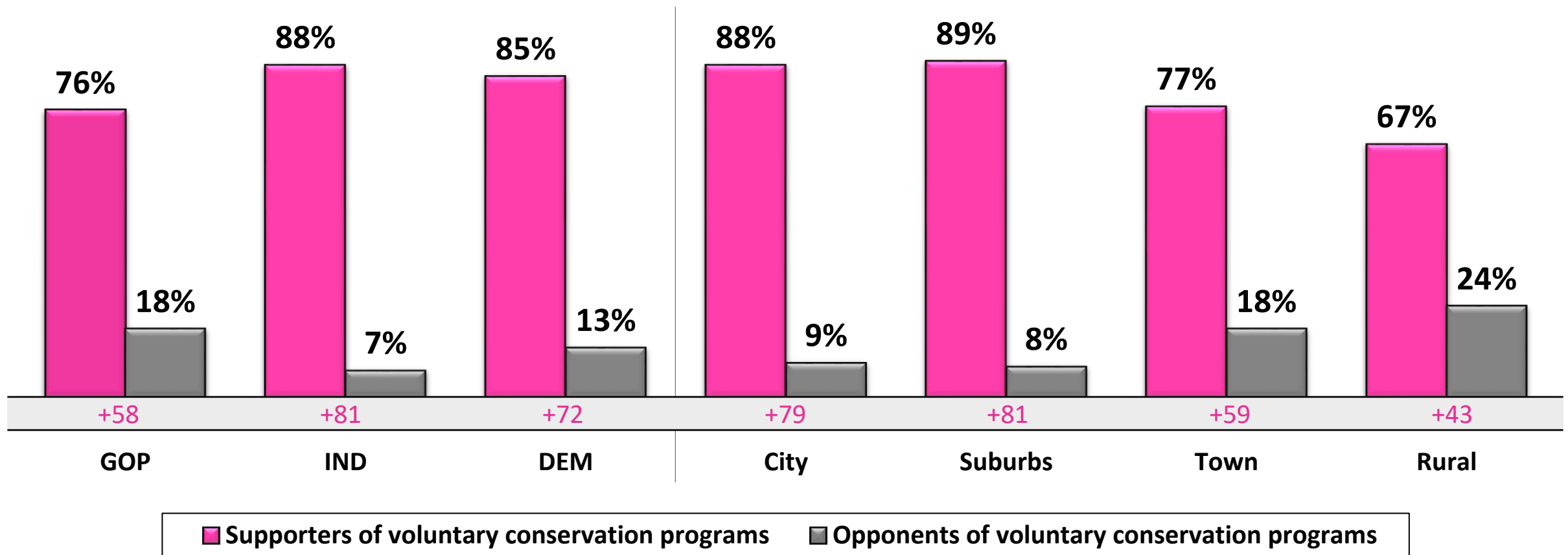
